Get to Know the New Storm Water Permit

WHAT: A current challenge in the planning and building industry today is understanding and achieving compliance with storm water regulations. On October 01, 2009, the North Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted a new storm water permit, which includes some new provisions. The December 2009 AEP Program will address the following questions:

- **How** does the new storm water permit differ from the previous permit?
- **What** do environmental professionals need to know in order to move forward with project planning, construction, and maintenance of projects to be compliant with the new storm water permit?
- **How** will local permit processes, such as for building, grading, and drainage permits, be affected?
- **What** are some "tips" for making projects, CEQA documentation, and permit applications compliant with the new storm water permit?
