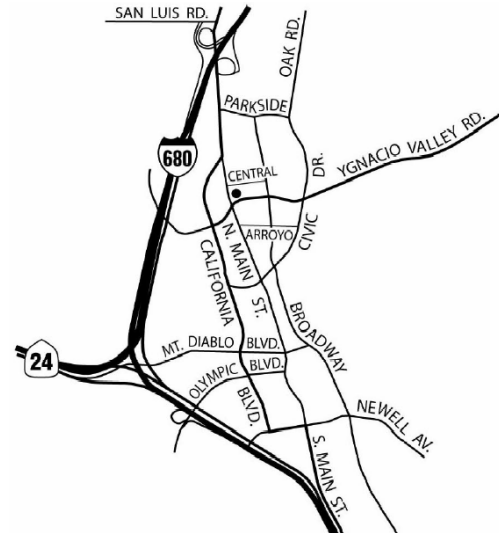
PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Randy Anderson is owner and Principal of LandPeople, a landscape architecture and planning firm specializing in trail, open space and park planning. Michael Kent is an AEP member, Principal of Michael Kent and Associates, and environmental consultant in the Bay Area for many years. Randy and Michael will highlight some of the trail and related park and open space projects they have worked on, and planning and environmental issues associated with trails of various types and in various settings.

“Trails” include a broad range of facilities, from rough, remote rural tracks, to paved, lighted and landscaped routes in heavily urbanized settings. Rural trails tend to go hand-in-hand with open space and natural resource protection. Urban trails relate strongly to land use and transportation planning. The presentation will cover questions such as:

- What are the main differences between recreational trails and bicycle and pedestrian pathways that function as transportation systems?
- What factors make the greatest difference in successfully implementing both types of trails?
- What are the best approaches to addressing environmental issues, and other implementation issues?
