SB 375 Technical Overview and Regional Update

WHAT: Learn about the requirements of SB 375 – Redesigning Communities to Reduce Greenhouse Gases. Find out how the law will impact local land use planning through the regional transportation planning process, the CEQA review process, and the regional housing needs allocation process. Speakers will explain the implementation process now underway. The Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) and Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) will provide a progress report on Bay Area greenhouse gas reduction targets and the Sustainable Community Strategy. Time will be provided to ask questions and give input about the process to these implementing agencies.

WHO: **Ted Droettboom** is Regional Planning Program Director for the Joint Policy Committee (JPC), a consortium of four San Francisco Bay Area agencies: ABAG, the Bay Area Air Quality Management District, the Bay Conservation and Development Commission, and MTC. He has also worked in a variety of planner and local-government manager capacities in Washington State, Maryland, the Bahamas, and in British Columbia, Canada.

Doug Johnson is the MTC's Senior Planner for Land Use Coordination and Social Equity. In that capacity he oversees the agency's \$100 million planning and grant programs that directly support the development of compact, transit supportive communities. He is also responsible for MTC's fund programs that support transportation equity including the Lifeline Program and the Community Based Transportation Plan program.

Bill Yeates has been the attorney of record in several published environmental, CEQA, and planning and zoning land use cases. Mr. Yeates and the lawyers in Kenyon Yeates also review and comment on public agency environmental review and land use documents, prepare clients for administrative proceedings before state and local public agencies, and represent clients in state and local administrative proceedings.
